

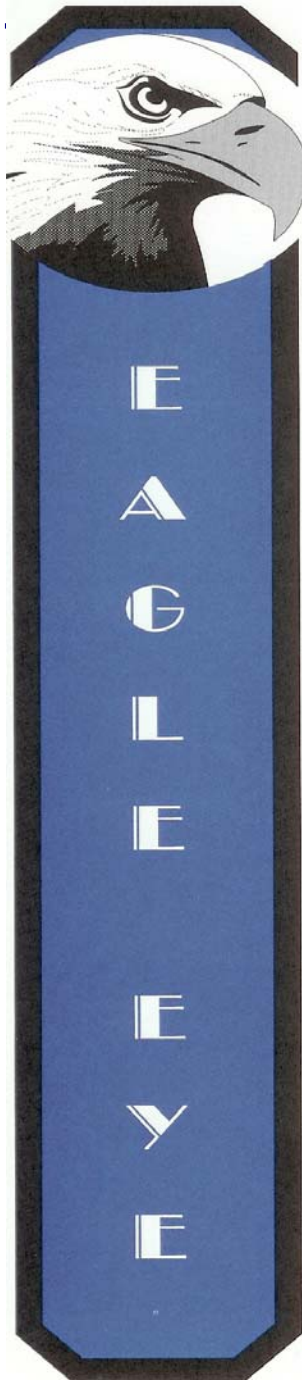

*(Continued from page 6)***Fifth Grade - Meet Albert Einstein!!!**

Albert Einstein once said, "I have no special talents, I am only passionately curious." Although some might disagree with his talent assessment, Einstein meant it. Let's Help Fifth Grade Scientists become passionately curious!!! Who knows? Maybe we have an Einstein on our hands!!!!

**Science/Language Arts:** Our Fabulous Fifth Graders have been working hard to prepare for the April 30 Science TAKS. In addition to hands-on science experiments and interactive review activities, students have been writing poetry about all of the science topics they have studied all year in science in their language arts classes. We have been exploring different poetry types including pyramid poems, cinquain, diamante, two-worder poems, alphabet poems and acrostics. We require the students to use scientific language to create meaningful poetry providing another disciplinary to review, internalize and take ownership of scientific concepts. I know you will enjoy the end results of the kids' hard work! We are very proud of the students' creative and imaginative work!

**TAKS:** We are not worried at all about the Science TAKS results! As you have already heard, our fifth graders did a phenomenal job on the Reading TAKS and Math TAKS. Our students have worked so hard this year... they have taken on the challenge of meeting new concepts and strategies with gusto and we are so proud of each and every student! Congratulations to you and your kids!

**Social Studies:** We have worked hard to learn about Manifest Destiny in Social Studies. As we have learned about Westward Expansion and the movement of groups like the pioneers, 49ers, Chinese Immigrants and the Mormons, we have learned that none of it was simple or easy! As groups moved west, it became apparent there was controversy about whether our new territories and states would be slave states or free states. Thus the **CIVIL WAR!** Students will learn and identify key events that led to the Civil War: the Missouri Compromise, the Underground Railroad, the Compromise of 1850, "Bleeding Kansas," and the election of Abraham Lincoln. Fifth graders will take a "walking tour" of the battle of Gettysburg to learn what life was like for soldiers who fought in the Union and Confederate armies during the Civil War. To conclude the activity, students will write a eulogy honoring those who fought and died during the Civil War.

Fifth graders are very busy indeed! We will spend the month of May learning about key historical events that have taken place in the United States since the Civil War. As we learn the importance of these events in modern-day America, we will conclude our year by celebrating each decade of the **Twentieth Century!** Hopefully, students will make connections and understand how their lives have been affected by key events of the Twentieth Century! We believe our students will leave Valley Oaks with a strong foundation in the history of our great country! **God Bless America!!!!**
